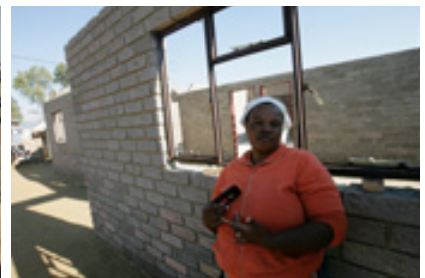
The following four families who reside in the Free State Province have benefited from RHLF by accessing loans from RHLF approved lenders.

MOILOA FAMILY

Rammulotsi, AK Section, Viljoenskroon (Northern Free State)



The Moilola family resides in Rammulotsi, Viljoenskroon, situated in Moqhaka Local Municipality. They moved from Double Pan in 1995 to Rammulotsi. The area has running water and electricity.

Mr Simon Moilola (not in pictures) borrowed R50, 000 from Mazwe Financial Services to incrementally build a 97.53 square meter house consisting of four bedrooms, one en-suite, two toilets, kitchen, lounge and a double garage. He used the money to purchase bricks, sand, cement and windows, door frames from a local supplier to start building

his house using a local builder. The construction is already underway and the house is nearing completion. In order to complete the house, the family still needs more money to buy 3,000 grey maxi bricks, 1,500 face bricks and roofing material.

Mr Moilola works for PRASA in Johannesburg and goes home on free weekends. The household consists of Mr Moilola's unemployed wife, their two children and three children of his late uncle. The family currently lives with their neighbours while their house is being built.

MOTSHEPE FAMILY

Ratau Extension, (Motheo District Municipality)



Mr Jeremane Kaizer Motshepe (not in pictures) works for C &H Transport in Secunda as a driver and his family resides in the Motheo District. He has a family of seven: four children, 2 grandchildren and his wife. His wife is a hawker and his oldest son is 29 years of age and is un-employed. Jeremane visits the family on a monthly basis.

He borrowed R36, 236 in May 2010 payable over 36 months from Real People to purchase building materials at Built It Thaba 'Nchu to extend the current family home. They live in a two bedroom house and are currently building an extra room, kitchen and sitting room. There is no sanitation, piped water in the area but they do have electricity.

THATJANE FAMILY

Selosetsha, Unit 1 Thaba 'Nchu (Motheo District Municipality)



Mr Molefi Thatjane, a 34 year old married father of a two year old boy from Selosetsha Unit 1 in Thaba 'Nchu came from Kroonstad and now lives with his wife and son. He borrowed R40, 000 over 36 months from Real People Holdings. After paying off the initial R15, 000 loan he is using some of his savings to incrementally build his house. He is building a three bedroomed house with a kitchen, study, dining room and double garage. He bought the

material from the Build It store in Thaba 'Nchu. Although the house is still under construction and they live in the space that has been completed already.

Mr Thatjane is employed as a Clerk at Thatohatsi Intermediate School in Botshabelo, whilst his wife is still studying. The area has running water, electricity and sanitation.

MISS NTSWAKI LEEMISA

Phase 9, Bloemside District Municipality



Ms Ntswaki Leemisa and her partner Mr Tebogo Tsele reside in an informal settlement at Bloemside side, phase 9. She is employed as a waitress by KKS Catering Company, a division of Compass Group, that has a contract at Pelonomi Hospital.

Her partner, Mr Tsele, is also employed by KKS as a cook and works at the same hospital. They have three boys who live with the couple's parents in Phahameng. Ntswaki took a loan of R10, 000 in September 2010 from Real People to

purchase building materials from Jack Bou store. They then used some of their money to build a two room brick and mortar house.

At the time of the visit they were moving out of the shack into the new house. As the picture shows, the shack was being demolished and the new building being roofed and window panes being put in. There's no sanitation on site but there is water and electricity.
